From the desk of the Bishop . . .

Last Sunday was terrific! It was the first planned gathering of all the faithful of All Saints Parish Family in the New Year. Many came together at one Holy Mass and the Christmas pageant and dinner.

There are two Mass celebrations every Sunday for most of the year, one Mass on Saturdays and one on Sundays during the summer, and several Mass celebrations for Christmas and for Easter. So, the parish family is divided most of the year.

It is very important that we plan single gatherings of all the members of our parish throughout the year. It is vital to our sense of being a “family” that we come together for communal worship, for spiritual unity in the Sacraments and for social fellowship. It is also essential that we be as inclusive as we can be. In other words, we need to provide opportunities for everyone to feel included and for as many people as possible to share their gifts. We should try as best we can to make everyone feel that he or she is a part of the whole family.

Thanks to those who took the initiative to direct the different parts of the festivities, I believe we accomplished a sense of being one family at the Holy Mass, Christmas pageant and dinner last Sunday. I thank everyone who came and I am especially grateful to those who played an instrumental role in the Mass, pageant and dinner.

Although some parishioners could not participate for reasons beyond their control, I hope others did not exaggerate excuses in order to exclude themselves. For example, I hope that those who were not here last Sunday did not neglect to come because of the Mass rite, the music, the play or the food that was selected.

Sometimes we are able to come to a parish function and we choose not to participate, but we must take care to understand God’s will and the greater good by taking part. We can grow closer to one another, grow as a parish family and promote an inclusive faith community when each of us puts forth the effort.
