L: That those in our community who are sick and suffering may be comforted, we pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: That those who have died may have eternal life, we pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

The Celebrant will now offer the concluding prayer:

C: God our Father, as You hear our prayers, grant that we may remain faithful to You all the days of our lives. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
