



Rev. Jaroslaw (Jerry) Rafalko Bishop Ordinary of the Diocese

Very Reverend and Reverend Fathers,

We were all saddened by this terrible news when we learned about the fire burning quickly through the 107-year-old beautiful church building in Minneapolis.

When I look at the building, I see a lot of memories taken away. This is a very important place where many people found their faith in Jesus Christ. The history of the church runs deep with many families in the area. The church has been a longstanding pillar of the community, offering worship services.

Yes, last week was a dark moment in our lives, but as we can see the fire on the church building is quenched, the smoke is gone. Thankfully, no one was hurt. There are no injuries to the firefighters and parishioners who tried to help save the building. The recovery will not happen in a day or two. The grief process will take its time. Under the guidance and care of Father John, with the support coming from the Diocesan Bishop Jerry, and from the office of the Prime Bishop Anthony, and from the parishes of the Polish National Catholic Church we will recover and we will rebuild this church to the glory of God and to the pride of God's people in Minneapolis.

Thank you to all who sent some help to Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Minneapolis. There is a need some extra help at this time before all the legal issues will be solved.

Please announce in your parishes that people can send their help directly to the parish, or they can send to the office of the Prime Bishop with the note on the check that it is a help to the Sacred Heart Parish in Minneapolis. Prime Bishop will announce this special campaign in God's Field and in all parishes of our Church.

Dear brothers, through these moments of suffering, we have an opportunity to grow and deepen our faith. We will go through this major crisis together and come through it.

While things are changing with the building, Sunday services will never stop there. The praying has not stopped either. Members of the parish will come together for the Holy Mass. The Holy Mass will be celebrated in the church hall.

We all know what is going on in Minneapolis at this time. I wanted to go there last Wednesday, but I was advised not to. I plan to go to Minneapolis at the beginning of May.

Please pray for this parish. Lord, we need you to come and restore our strength, and renew our minds. Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Minneapolis is in my thoughts and my prayers.


A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles:






