- **VISIT FROM PRIMATE** – Prime Bishop Anthony Mikovsky will be arriving at the Cathedral on Monday and will be visiting our Parish during Holy Week and for Easter. Please welcome him with your presence at the Holy Week services and the Resurrection Mass.
- **ST. CECILIA CHOIR REHEARSAL** – Special choir rehearsal for Easter Resurrection Liturgy and Mass:

Monday, April 15, 7:30PM promptly

All singers are welcome to attend and participate in the rehearsal.

- **MASS OF CHRISM** with Blessing of Holy Oils will take place on Tuesday, April 16 at 7PM here at All Saints Cathedral. Holy Oils used by the clergy in the diocese in administering some of the sacraments will be blessed by Prime Bishop Anthony Mikovsky at this Mass which will be attended by clergy and parishioners from other area parishes. Everyone is invited and encouraged to make every effort to attend.
- **GOOD FRIDAY ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT** – Pledge to spend at least one hour of meditation with the Lord on Good Friday, April 19. A sign-up sheet can be found on the cabinet in the vestibule.  
The Cathedral will be open from 9AM – 9PM for meditation.
- **SOUP & SALAD SUPPERS** were held before Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent. Thank you to the volunteers who provided these suppers each week. Your time and effort is deeply appreciated by the Parish.
- **REMINDER** – The PTO and the students and staff of the SoCI are still collecting plastic jar caps to be recycled in to ornamental benches which will be placed around our complex and within our cemetery. It takes 200 pounds of caps to make one bench and we have a long way to go. Help the environment and this project and save plastic caps and turn them in.

## PARISH NEWS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS



**PALM SUNDAY** – The Sunday before Easter, which recalls the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem during the last week of His life. Blessing of palms and a procession commemorating this event precede the principal Mass of the day. The celebrant, carrying a larger palm tied with a ribbon, is followed by the choir. The liturgical color of the day is purple.

**HOLY THURSDAY** – The Thursday in Holy Week which is properly called Maundy Thursday commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist (which is later celebrated on the special feast of Corpus Christi). The Mass denotes joy and thanksgiving. The cloth of white is adorned by the celebrant and he sings the “Glory Be To God” during which time all the bells are rung. After the choir is finished singing, the organ and bells are silent until the Resurrection Day Mass. Following the procession to the altar of repose, the stripping of the altars takes place. Three hosts are consecrated: one for the Mass of the day, another for the Mass of the Presanctified on Good Friday, and the third Host is placed in the Ciborium. Within the cathedrals, the bishops bless oils (of catechumens, crism of the sick) which are used for the sacraments throughout the year. The liturgical color is white and the purple veil on the cross of the main altar is replaced with a white one. The liturgical color for the Tenebrae services of the PNCC is purple. The main altar and the Repository should be appropriately decorated with flowers for this Mass. The Blessed Sacrament at the altar of Repose is reserved for veneration by the faithful.

**GOOD FRIDAY** – The liturgical color is black in commemoration of the Passion and Death of Christ. The reading of the Passion and the veneration of the cross are an important part of the liturgy for this day. In the Mass of the Presanctified, the Cred, Gloria, Introit and the regular Canon of consecration are omitted. The purple veil on the Cross of the main altar is replaced with a black one. In the center aisle of the church, a small rug, pillow and two candlesticks are prepared for the celebrant to place the Cross of adoration. The symbolical grave of Christ is prepared for the afternoon service. On “Good Friday”, the evening services are conducted to local traditions. “Tenebrae Services” are celebrated. The faithful should spend some time to adore and meditate before the Blessed Sacrament.

**HOLY SATURDAY** – The day before Easter Sunday, blessing of the New Fire, Paschal Candle, 5 grains of Incense, and water begins the liturgy for Holy Saturday. The reading of the Prophecies and reciting of the Litany of All Saints, precedes the Holy Mass. The liturgical color for the blessings is purple and for the Mass, the color is white. The blessing of Easter Food is usually done in the afternoon.

**EASTER SUNDAY** – The first Sunday after the full moon following the vernal equinox (between March 22 and April 25) commemorates the Resurrection of Christ from the dead. Easter determines the dates of movable feasts and the number of Sundays after Epiphany and Pentecost. The Resurrection Day Mass is preceded by the solemn procession; the Processional Cross, the Paschal Candle, the Cross with the Red Stole, Statue of the Resurrected Christ, members of the Blessed Sacrament Society with candles, children with flowers, altar servers, the celebrant with the Blessed Sacrament, and the choir. The liturgical color is white but gold may be substituted.

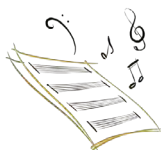

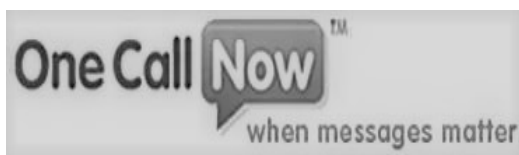
